

BURIAL OF GEN. ALFRED SULLY.

From the Philadelphia Ledger, May 19.

The remains of Gen. Alfred Sully, son of the late Thomas Sully, artist, who died at Fort Vancouver, Washington Territory, three weeks since, arrived in this city on Friday morning last, and was interred on Saturday afternoon, at Laurel Hill Cemetery. The remains were dressed in a full military suit and inclosed in a leaden casket. Those of his intimate male friends attending the funeral, which was conducted very quietly, were Henry C. Carey, Drs. Wister and Woodhouse, Ferdinand Dreer, T. D. Pratt, Gen. Rutter, Lieut. Eckstein, who was attached to his regiment at Fort Vancouver, and the immediate male members of the family. The widow of the deceased, with her two children, accompanied the remains from Fort Vancouver.
